World's chesses

The shape of the chess pieces and the rules for the moves they can make differ depending on the type of chess played. The shape of shogi pieces is similar to that of Chinese and Korean chess pieces, which are distinguished by writings on a flat wooden base, while Western chess pieces and Southeast Asian chess pieces are three-dimensional carved figures. In addition, pieces in shogi move in the same way as in Western chess, within squares. However, the biggest feature that distinguishes shogi from other chesses is that pieces captured from the opponent can be reused as your own pieces, and this can be said to be a rule unique to shogi.
